This funding will be used to

- Increase percentage of students in Prep-Year 6 receiving a C or higher in English to 90%.
- Increase percentage of students in Prep-Year 6 receiving a C or higher in Mathematics to 90%.
- Embed all stages of moderation for English and Mathematics (M1 M4).
- Embed whole school Pedagogical Practices as the shared language of teaching and learning and provide opportunities for coaching and feedback to build staff capability in implementing the agreed pedagogical practices.
- Embed Case Management processes that leads to improved student learning (English).

Our initiatives include

- Continue to work with Sugar Coast Cluster (5 like schools) and employ a Head Of Department: Curriculum, to work within the cluster.
- Continue to deepen teacher's knowledge of Australian Curriculum English and Mathematics by embedding all stages of moderation (M1 – M4).
- Embed the whole school Pedagogical Practices and formalise Coaching and Feedback cycles.
- Improve student learning (English) through Case Management meetings and processes.

Providing additional teacher aide support to classrooms for English and Mathematics	\$10,710
